- Great pay: Annual foodservice distribution driver pay averages up to \$79,000 plus benefits. Unlike other trucking jobs, foodservice distribution drivers are paid hourly, not by the mile.
- Work-life balance: Foodservice distribution drivers work an average
 of 50 hours a week and drive only about 200 miles per route, on
 average, meaning they are home every night. In addition, many
 foodservice distributors are moving away from weekend delivery.
- Advancement opportunities: The Foodservice distribution industry provides many advancement opportunities - many transportation leaders started as drivers.
